

Minutes of Crockett PTA Meeting

1. Meeting was called to order by President Denise Soto at 7:35 pm.
2. **Treasurer's Report (Treasurer Jocelyn Ortega).**
--\$4,284.55 in general account
--\$185.54 in gaming account
For Back to School Night the 50/50 brought in \$85.00, and general membership and other sales brought in \$154.00

4. **Principals's Report Starts, Principal Roxann Clarke-Holmes**
Robo Call was made to inform parents of suspicion of mold in one of the classrooms. Environmental specialist came out to check out suspected classrooms (10/11/18). Testing for mold, inspecting vents, under sinks, etc. Surface mold is non-toxic, black mold is toxic. Waiting for results of the report. Moving kids around out of classes suspected of mold. Waiting for the ok to return to classes. The weather (humidity) may be the cause, especially in rooms with AC. Previous tests have come back negative.
5. Parent workshops—involvement opportunities—Growth Mindset with Blake Brandeis, one in Fall, one in Spring. One Love (Healthy Relationships) Security committee (parents). **Principal's Report Ends.**
6. **President's Report, President Denise Soto.** Back to School Night, we had 34 new members sign up. 152 total members as of today. Students can sign up too. PTA membership—goals of more staff involved, and 400 memberships.

Need to host an event before November ends. “Wacky Races” idea, student council may help, PE teacher may help, “Field Day” concept, “Turkey Burner” and National PTA would like to attend. Carnival Style games, yoga/pizza., Key Club volunteers, STARS, the NEWS (all youth organizations within Hamilton township high schools). Possibility of keeping the kids after school and having parents pick up and, serve dinner and do a family activity. Potato sack races, obstacle course, maze, Minute to Win It, yoga, Zumba, martial arts, escape room, clues, running from place to place. **End of President's Report.**
10. **Fundraising Report, VP of Fundraising Lisa Schulz.** Uno's Doughraiser on October 18, we get 20% of all food sales. Tricky Tray on November 16, volunteers and items needed, businesses, group donations. Doors open at 6 pm and raffles start at 7:30 pm.
